As you may be aware that to strengthen the under-graduate and postgraduate education in colleges across the country and drive there towards excellence the Commission introduced a scheme entitled, “**Colleges with Potential for Excellence**” (CPE) during X plan period. Limited numbers of Colleges are selected under the scheme from each state. Such selected Potential Colleges are being substantially funded to improve their standards in teaching research, comparable to International Standards. These colleges are expected to improve their academic infrastructure, adopt innovations in teaching, pursue modern methods of learning and evaluation and also introduce flexible approach in the selection of courses. In the years to come, such colleges would act as a role model for other colleges in their area of operation. During X Plan period, 97 colleges have been selected.

The XI Plan guidelines for CPE have now been formulated and the same have been posted on the UGC website [www.ugc.ac.in](http://www.ugc.ac.in). The guidelines of this scheme can be downloaded from the website of the UGC.

All the eligible Universities are requested to invite the proposals in the prescribed proforma (**Annexure-I**) from the colleges under their jurisdiction. The University shall constitute a committee consisting of the Vice-Chancellor, Registrar/ Dean of College Development Council and an expert from outside the State to check the data and information provided by the college in the Proposal with the records and verify whether the claims made by the college are correct, and also to allot scores for specific parameters as per the Scoring Scale and to arrive at the total score obtained by the colleges. The Scoring Scales for each parameter has been specified by the UGC, which are confidential and are being sent to the University separately. You are, therefore, requested to recommended and forward proposals of only **five** Colleges of your University on the basis of maximum scores obtained by them alongwith with the original copy of the proposal of each college and the total scores obtained by them to the UGC for further consideration as per the selection procedures stipulated in the XI Plan guidelines of the scheme. The proposals of the recommended Colleges may be forwarded to UGC on or before **30<sup>th</sup> November, 2008** for further action on part of the UGC.

The University is requested to forward a copy of this letter and the guidelines to all such colleges under your jurisdiction, which are included under Section 2(f) & 12B of the UGC Act by Speed Post and e-mail with a request to the Principals of the colleges to download the guidelines so that to enable them to submit their applications to the university well before the stipulated date.
