2. Based on the Report submitted by the XI Plan UGC Visiting Committee and availability of funds from the Government of India, UGC has approved the tentative XI Plan Allocation, subject to availability of funds from Government of India, in respect of your University as under:

- 3. The 'on account' grant already under the above schemes released by UGC during XI Plan Period will be a part of XI Plan Allocation of the university. Further, funds for Merged Schemes is based on the eligibility criteria indicated in the XI Plan Guidelines. Therefore, the grant for each of the merged scheme will be released subject to the fulfillment of the eligibility criteria and other related norms as laid down for the purpose.
- 4. A new scheme called Internal Quality Assurance Cell has also been included in the merged schemes and an additional amount of Rs.5.00 lakhs has been allocated to each State University. The Guidelines of this Scheme may be seen on UGC website www.ugc.ac.in
- 5. The XI Plan Allocation is subject to compliance of the Academic Reforms as already circulated by the UGC vide its D.O.No.F.1-2/2008 (XI Plan) dated 30<sup>th</sup> March/21<sup>st</sup> April, 2009 which is also available on UGC website www.ugc.ac.in.
- 6. In addition to above, the following Administrative Reforms may also be implemented:
  - Implementation of the Govt. of India Reservation Policy of SC/ST.
  - All Statutory posts should be filled up the appointment through Selection Committee as per the UGC Regulations.
  - All vacant Teaching Posts should be filled up expeditiously.
  - Annual Accounts, Annual Reports and Quality assessment Status Report should be submitted in time i.e. by 31<sup>st</sup> December of every year.
- 7. The release of grant will also be linked to Academic and Administrative Reforms as well as compliance of various policies of Government of India rules.
- 8. You are also requested to utilize proportionate grant on half yearly basis. Any portion which remain unutilized will be considered to be lapsed. UGC will also consider to

allocate the unutilized grant of the university to other universities which are better performing and are also following the various academic reforms as well as implementation of various policies of Government of India. Therefore, the University is advised to utilize the grant fully.

- 9. The amount recommended by the Visiting Committee for various merged schemes may be utilized as per guidelines of respective schemes available on UGC website. The anomaly if any as per pattern of assistance/guidelines may be brought to the notice of the Commission.
- 10. You are, therefore requested to re-work the priorities of university within the General Development Grant allocation as decided by the Commission and keeping in view the recommendation of the Visiting Committee. The revised proposal (item-wise and year-wise plan) in the prescribed format UGC (copy enclosed) may be sent within 15 days in duplicate along with the soft copy within the ceiling conveyed to University. After receipt of the item-wise allocation within the amount as decided by the Committee, the UGC will convey the final approval of XI Plan Allocation to the University.
- 11. A copy of the Report of the Visiting Committee is enclosed herewith for further necessary action at the University level.

At the outset, Prof. A.K. Kapoor, Vice-Chancellor of the University welcomed the members of the committee, and gave a brief presentation and introduced the senior faculty members to the committee. #### INTRODUCTION

0

Jiwaji University was established as a teaching and affiliating University on 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 1964, by Government of Madhya Pradesh by issuing Ordinance no.15 of 1963, Dr.Sarwapalli Radhakrishnan, the then President of India, laid down the foundation stone of the University Campus on December, 11, 1964. The Campus finally came up at the famous Nao-Lakha parade ground after a generous allocation of 248 aces of land by the M.P. State Government. Over a period of years, the University has earned a location advantage. The place of its location is now recognized as the centre of the city, thereby making it easily accessible from all parts of the city. Right from its inception, Jiwaji University started with a status of a residential and an affiliating University. The territorial jurisdiction of the affiliation initially extended to six districts of Gwalior and Chambal Division, viz., Gwalior, Morena, Bhind, Guna, Shivpuri and Datia. With the formation of two new districts viz., Ashok Nagar and Sheopur, the number of districts under jurisdiction has risen to eight. The University had a total of 216 affiliated colleges. This calls for aligning and sprucing up of various structures at the university level to withstand the expansion in order to ensure that a healthy system of education is fostered in the jurisdiction.

The Committee recommends **Rs.60.00 lacs** for four hostels to provide all the above facilities in each existing hostel.

#### **GUEST HOUSE**

The University has a newly constructed Guest House with 20 rooms. The committee recommends **Rs.10.00** lacs for purchasing of 10 Airconditioners (1.50 tons), 10 LCD (21"), 10 Refrigerators (160 ltr.) etc. for furnishing Rooms in this University Guest House.

#### **HEALTH CENTRE / CANTEEN**

The Physical Education Department of the University takes care of the games and sports among the students. Dean, Students Welfare looks after the extra-curricular activities of the University. This wing has developed advanced facilities for music, dance and drama and other performing arts with an auditorium well equipped for such events. The university has been hosting national, state and regional level Youth Festivals. Health centre has very less equipments. The committee recommends Rs.10.00 lacs to equip the health centre with basic equipment that could be useful to conduct basic health parameters such as 3-AC, ECG machine, Ultrasound Scanners, Automatic Analyzer, Spectrophotometer, etc. The committee also recommends Rs.25.00 lacs for renovation and upgradation of University Canteen with additional amenities to provide hygiene and with latest kitchen appliances.

#### **PUBLICATIONS**

Most of the Science departments are very active in research and produced research papers while some of them could bag International awards.
