DURING DECEMBER 13 TO 15, 2010

I. Background of the University

The Jayoti Vidyapeeth Women's University, Jaipur has been established and incorporated under the Act 17 of 2008 passed by Rajasthan State Legislature and notified by the Government of Rajasthan through its official Gazette Notification No. F.2 (23) Vidhi /2/2008 dated April 21, 2008.

The Jyoti Vidyapeeth Trust, a Public Trust, having its registered office at 143, Gome Defence Colony, Vaishali Nagar, Jaipur is the Sponsoring Body of the University. The Trust was created by execution of a Trust Deed on 14th November, 2003 under provision of the Registration Act 1908 (Central Act No 16 of 1908) noted at serial number 1417 of the book no 4, in the office of Sub-Registrar, Jaipur II.

IV. Observation & Suggestions Made by the Committee

The Jayoti Vidyapeeth Women's University, Jaipur was established by State Government under Jayoti Vidyapeeth Women's University Act 17 of 2008 passed by Rajasthan State Legislature and notified by the Government of Rajasthan through official Gazette Notification No. F.(23)Vidhi/2/2008 dated April 21, 2008.

The visit of the Committee was from 13-15th December, 2010.

The Committee was received and extended welcome by the Vice Chancellor, S.K. Vashistha, The Registrar, Meghna Singhal, Deans and other faculty members. After a brief introduction, Prof. S.K. Vashistha, Vice Chancellor Initiated the presentation and invited one of his colleagues to make the presentation on the working of the University and academic programmes running and programmes conceived for the future. Incidentally, it is to mention that in the state of Rajasthan the designation of the Vice Chancellor is changed as President of the University. As informed by the University authorities.

The presentation was comprehensive and covered the relevant areas. Several clarifications were sought by Committee Members. On the whole, the members were impressed by the presentation.

The faculty-wise observation and suggestion made by the Committee are as under:

Faculty of Management and Humanities

This faculty consists of two main departments, namely Department of Management & Commerce and Department of Humanities & Social Sciences. The infrastructural facilities for the department are excellent including multimedia network in the class rooms, lecture theaters and tutorial rooms. While the department of Management and Commerce offers a variety of courses like B.com, BBA, MBA (various streams), including integrated course, the Department of Humanities & Social Sciences offer both UG and PG programmes (English, Political, Science and Education).

With a view to ensure consistency and economic viability of the programme, it would be worthwhile if a programme is undertaken only when reasonable number of students are available to join the course.

As regards human resources, like any other Private/ Government Institution, the University is faced with human resource crunch in as much as that seven out of twelve faculty members joined department of Management during the last 3 months. Same is the case in the Department of Humanities & Social Sciences.

The department may identify one of the senior teachers as Training And Placement Officer to keep constant liaison with the industry not only for summer training, final placements, but also for the review of the curriculum as per the changing needs of the industry. Besides, there is an urgent need for induction of senior experienced and qualified faculty members by offering UGC packages and other incentives to lure them to be a part of the University on a permanent footing.

Faculty of Engineering & Technology

This faculty comprises three departments, namely Department of Biotechnology, Department of Electronics & Communication and Department of Computer Science & IT. The Committee examined in detail the admission process, curriculum and syllabi, examination system and other academic activities including Laboratories and it was found that the same were of reasonably satisfactory standards. However, the Research and Development (R&D) activities need to be strengthened by way of publishing research papers in peer refereed journals of repute. Further, there is a need to undertake R & D projects for overall development of students and faculty members. To assist the R&D process and teaching, some more senior faculty members with strong R&D records and adequate qualifications should be inducted. The list of number of experiments in each laboratory should be prepared and prominently displayed.

In summary, the Committee found the performance of faculty of Engineering & Technology at the University in terms of physical and academic infrastructure, proper academic (instruction and evaluation) process was satisfactory and a zeal to improve continuously. The number and variety of subjects covered are good and ensure broad based education of all the students. The infrastructure of this faculty is par excellence. The situation in terms of research output is less satisfactory, but that is inevitable keeping in view that the University is still in its infancy. Intel 8086 kits may be procured and included in the curriculum. The curriculum of B. Tech (CS & IT), B. Tech (EC) M.Tech (VLSI Design) needs to be upgraded along with provision for six months dissertation for all M.Tech programmes.

Faculty of Medical Sciences

Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences

The Department of Pharmacy, Jayoti Vidyapeeth Women's University, Jaipur, has adequate laboratory, computer and classrooms etc. It has already commenced two PG programmes w.e.f. 2010 academic session in Pharmacology (4 students) and Pharmaceutics (5 students). The University should have more senior faculty members with Ph. D. degree and more sophisticated analytical and pharmacology equipments.

The Committee had adequate interactions with faculty members, students and non-teaching members of the University as well. During the course of interaction with various stakeholders, it came to the notice of the Committee that the staff was getting consolidated salary. The reason was that they were short of qualifications as prescribed by the UGC. One more reason mentioned was that the University was hardly two and half years old. It is, however, suggested that there is an urgent need for induction of senior experienced and qualified faculty by offering UGC packages and other incentives to lure them to be a part of the University on a permanent footing.

There was a general feeling that the teacher be allowed to participate in the refresher courses, which would enable them to know latest know-how in the respective subjects. It was also felt there should be a provision of self-appraisal by the teaching staff. The Committee was happy to observe the students participated in the various activities organized on the campus. There was a general feeling amongst the students, and Committee members were also in agreement with the students that the **Trimester System** was very hectic which doesn't give minimum required time of 6 weeks for project work and industrial training which would ultimately help the students in better placements. The Committee is of the opinion that reasonable time to may be allowed to the University to adopt to **Semester System** as per UGC guidelines. The non-teaching staff be provided opportunities for skill up gradation which would also help them in fetching higher pay. It is also suggested that the facility of Provident Fund be extended to all the faculty members and non-teaching staff.

The institute is following the AICTE norms. Some of them include: Land comprises 30 acres. The bank deposit is to the tune of 104.54 lacs. The Administrative block area of 3965 Sq. m, Academic block area 18116 Sq. m and Residential block area 20692 Sq. m. There are 7 lecture theatre and 21 class rooms. The Library has 1245 Sq. m with 20,892 books, 78 journals, 70 (print and online), 08 online. The University has Laboratories for the 1st year and Laboratories for the specific departments.

There was a consensus among the Committee Members that the library be augmented with more books. They may plan to keep Chemistry Laboratory on the ground floor instead of third floor (now functioning) for the reason that the drained acid may spoil the pipelines in course of time and other safety considerations.

It is also advised to have an examination hall of capacity of 500 and more students.

The syllabi and fee structure are approved by the competent authority. All the information, provided in the Annexures, as far as possible, have been verified and found satisfactory. Service book of all the employees must be maintained. Vacant positions may be filled on regular basis at the earliest. The University has given an affidavit that it fulfils the minimum criteria in terms of programmes, faculty infrastructure facility, financial viability etc. as lead from time to time by the UGC and other Statutory Bodies.

Recommendations made by the Committee

Taking into consideration various aspects, the Committee is of the opinion that the review of the university for the purpose of inspection etc. may be under taken after a period of three years.
