REPORT OF THE INSPECTION COMMITTEE ON ITS VISIT TO
HIMGIRI NABH VISHWAVIDYALAYA, (A PRIVATE
UNIVERSITY), DEHRADUN, UTTARAKHAND FROM 14TH TO
15TH NOVEMBER, 2009.

I. BACKGROUND OF UNIVERSITY:

Himgiri Nabh Vishwavidyalaya has been established under Act No. 17 of 2003 of the State Legislative Assembly, Government of Uttaranchal (Act 2003, Uttaranchal Adhiniyam Sankhya 17 of 2003). The University was declared as a Private University on 1st October, 2005. The purpose of the establishment is to meet the growing demand for trained human resources in various social, educational, scientific, technical and professional organizations so as to channel human energy towards sustainable economic and social development.

VISION: The vision of the University is to become a world class University and to be a harbinger for vocationalisation of higher education through the conventional as well as through the open and distance learning modes in order to meet the future demands for trained human power in the country.

MISSION: The mission of the University is to provide educational opportunities to all segments of society, without discrimination of any kind. In addition to regular face-to-face education, Himgiri Nabh Vishwavidyalaya will, through the use of modern technologies of communications, bring education to the doorsteps of all those who did not have access to higher education earlier or were denied such an access.

OBJECTIVES: The objectives of the University are as under:-

- To reduce the gap between the demand and supply for skilled human power in the country;
- To provide alternative vocational options for pursuing higher education;
- To develop, design and teach innovative, flexible, professional and technical programmes so as to provide the best possible education of the highest academic standards;
- To create and generate opportunities of education at the learner's doorstep in order to suit the individual's pace and choice;
- To offer vocational education to enhance individual employability and create new employment opportunities;
- To develop and improve technology-mediated learning methods;
- To enhance the reach of higher education within India as well as abroad;
- To establish, maintain and recognize regional centres and study centres to bridge the gap between learners and teachers;
- To induct by guiding them to choose professional education of their choice;
- To adopt innovative methods of teaching by involvement of service industry as a field area for practical exposure of classroom learning.

Prior to the actual assessment of the physical and academic infrastructure of the Himgiri Nabh Vishwavidyalaya, Prof. T. Tirupati Rao, Chairman and Dr. Shakeel Ahmad, Member-Secretary, of the Expert Committee briefed all members including nominee of the AICTE, NCTE and COA about the purpose of the Visit.

The members of the Expert Committee were received by the Vice-Chancellor, Registrar, Officer-on-Special Duty and Dean of the Faculties. After a formal introduction of the Expert Members, the Vice-Chancellor of the University made a presentation on the activities and programmes offered by the University. The mission, vision and objectives were shared with the members of the Expert Committee. After the presentation, a number of queries were raised by the Expert Members. The University authorities replied to the queries. Thereafter, the Expert Members visited the available infrastructure. The Committee had a detailed discussion with the students, teaching faculty and members of the management.

The Inspection Report based on the presentation made by the University Authorities, discussion with students, teaching staff and members of the Board of Governors and documents/information provided by the Registrar of the University is as follows:

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IV. Observations of the Committee:

1. The University has total five faculties. But there are only three faculties which offer courses such as B.Arch., B.Ed. and M.Tech.
2. The University is in the outskirts of the city and the approach road is required to be developed.
3. The University has recently shifted to its campus as earlier it was functioning from the rented building.
4. At present, University has not sufficient funds for the development of infrastructure. However, efforts are being made to get more funds so that academic and physical infrastructure could be developed.
5. All teaching and non-teaching staff is working on the contractual basis.
6. Most of the courses are run through the visiting faculty only.
7. The University has started M.Tech. Course without approval of the AICTE.
8. So far, there is no separate administrative block to run the university. All faculties have been housed in a single three block building and classrooms are shared by all three faculties which offer courses. Even, the functions of the university administration are carried out from the same blocks. There is no proper place for sitting of Vice-Chancellor, Deans of faculties, Registrar, Controller of Examinations and other officers.
9. There is no proper arrangement of convening/organizing the meetings for discussing various professional and other issues.
10. The Library is very small and not well-equipped latest books and journals.
11. All three faculties which are offering courses have a small common computer lab which is used by all these faculties.
12. There is no sports and other facilities for the students.
13. The University has an intake of 40 in B.Arch. But only 16 students have been admitted during the academic session 2009-10. Even in the previous academic sessions, university was not able to attract the students. Hence, seats remain vacant.
14. The laboratory for B.Arch., including studio and computer facilities are not sufficient. However, students expressed that they are satisfied with the teaching and faculty.
15. As far as the faculty and strength of students in the B.Ed. programme is concerned, it is satisfactory.

16. University has been successful in collaboration with some international educational institutions.
17. University has to make necessary efforts to create research environment.
18. The land has been provided by the State Government on leased basis (for 90 years)

V. Suggestions:

1. University should focus on consolidation of the existing academic programmes rather than introducing more new programmes.
2. University should expedite the construction work so that the facilities as per the requirements of the statutory bodies are fulfilled.
3. University should make necessary efforts to establish good laboratories including computer lab for the existing programmes.
4. There is an urgent need of preliminary medical aid facility for the students as well as staff members.
5. In order to attract the good faculty, the University should build the residential quarters immediately.
6. In order to attract the students for the programmes, there is a need to build hostel for girls and boys separately on priority basis.
7. University should make hard efforts to get funds in the form of donations to create academic and physical infrastructure.

Specific Observations of the AICTE Nominee:

1. The University has not obtained approval of the AICTE to start M.Tech. Course.
2. The University is not meeting the norms of the AICTE in respect of faculty and infrastructure.
3. The classes of M.Tech. course is taken mostly by the Visiting Faculty.
4. University has not developed proper lab for the M.Tech. Course.

Specific Observations of the NCTE Nominee:

1. The University has obtained approval from NCTE to run the B.Ed. Course.
2. Two more faculty needs to be recruited as per the NCTE norms.
3. Labs need to be strengthened.

Specific Observations of the COA Nominee:

1. The University has obtained approval to run the B.Arch. Programme from Council of Architecture. However, the shortfall as pointed out by the Council have to be complied with.
2. At present, the faculty strength needs augmentation. The workload is shared by the Visiting Faculty.
3. The university has recently shifted to new premises and therefore, it has to develop proper and adequate infrastructural facilities.
4. The library needs to be upgraded.

VI. Recommendations of the Committee:

In view of the above facts and observations, discussion with students, teachers and members of Board of Governors, the Expert Committee is of the opinion that the Himgiri Nabh Vishwavidyalaya (A Private University), Dehradun, Uttarakhand established by an Act of State Legislature, is not yet ready to receive recognition from the UGC, as there are many deficiencies observed in the development of the University in respect of the criteria outlined in the UGC (Establishment of and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulations, 2003. The deficiencies pointed out above need to be attended to in terms of rectification, improvement and enforcement. Until such time the deficiencies pointed out above are complied with and later verified by the Inspection Committee of the UGC in a period of 1-2 years, the HNV may not be considered for recognition by the UGC.
