REPORT OF THE UGC EXPERT COMMITTEE CONSTITUTED FOR AN ON-THE-SPOT INSPECTION OF O.P. JINDAL GLOBAL UNIVERSITY, SONEPAT, HARYANA (HARYANA STATE PRIVATE UNIVERSITY) TO ASSESS ITS ACADEMIC AND PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE IN TERMS OF UGC (ESTABLISHMENT OF AND MAINTENANCE OF STANDARDS IN PRIVATE UNIVERSITIES) REGULATIONS, 2003.

I) BACKGROUND OF THE UNIVERSITY

O. P. Jindal Global University (JGU) is a non-profit university established in 2009 by Haryana Private Universities (Amendment) Ordinance, 2009 under the Haryana Private Universities Act, 2006. The Ordinance was later enacted as the Haryana Private Universities (Second Amendment) Act, 2009 under *The Haryana Private Universities Act 2006*.

Presently, the University campus is spread out over 54 acres of land. The land is owned by the sponsoring body of the University, Om Prakash Jindal Gramin Jan Kalyan Sansthan, which has provided the initial cost of land, buildings and all other infrastructure for setting up of the University. The initial cost of land, buildings and all other infrastructure for setting up JGU was provided by the sponsoring body out of its funds. Jindal Steel and Power Ltd., which is part of O.P. Jindal Group, has undertaken to render its full financial support to the sponsoring body and JGU to meet financial requirements for establishing and running O.P. Jindal Global University.

IV. OBSERVATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE

1. The University at present is running two programmes, viz., Five -year B.A. LL.B. (Hons.) and Three year LL.B. (Hons.) with the approval of BCI.
2. The University proposes to start following courses in the coming academic sessions:
 - Two-year LL.M. Courses proposed to be started from the Academic Year 2010
 - a. International Trade Law
 - b. Corporate and Financial Law
 - c. Intellectual Property Rights
 - Ph.D. programme from the Academic Year 2011-12.

3. The available infrastructure for running the existing courses and starting the proposed courses from coming academic session, in terms of faculty, available classrooms, library, hostel facilities etc. is quite satisfactory.
4. The University has well equipped library in terms of text books, journals, e-journals and other reference material.
5. The University has state of art technically advanced auditorium and lecture halls and has IT enabled teaching-learning practices in place.
6. The University has adequate and experienced faculty with a global flavour for both Law and Business Schools.
7. The Committee is quite satisfied with the financial viability of the University for running the present and proposed courses.
8. The Committee observed that at present the University Campus is spread out over 54 acres of land which is owned by the sponsoring body, i.e., “Om Prakash Jindal Gramin Jan Kalyan Sansthan”.
9. The Committee is satisfied to note that the University is developing its infrastructure in terms of buildings and faculty at a fast pace.
10. The Committee noted that the University has entered into collaborations, exchange programmes, research partnerships and other forms of engagement and interaction with leading universities and institutions across the globe.
11. The University has published the inaugural issue of Jindal Global Law Review (JGLR) in September 2009, with paper contributions from Pro-Vice-Chancellor and several from International Board of Advisors of the University.
12. O.P. Jindal Global University and University of Cambridge are running a training programme for mid-career IPS officers. University of Cambridge Institute of Criminology is the funding source.

V. SUGGESTIONS OF THE COMMITTEE

1. The hostel rooms are required to be made more comfortable particularly regarding the positioning of beds and availability of moving space for the students.
2. The Committee felt that the fee charged for the running and proposed programmes is on higher side and need to be fixed as per the norms of UGC.

VII. RECOMMENDATION OF THE COMMITTEE

The Committee, after having interacted with the Vice Chancellor, Governing Body Members, faculty and students; verifying the available infrastructure in terms of available faculty, buildings, classrooms, hostels and other facilities for the students and the staff; and going through the various documents, is quite satisfied with the available faculty and the programmes, infrastructural facilities, financial viability and the progress made by the University in short span of time.
