The University has three academic blocks having more than 66 class rooms/tutorials, sufficient number of laboratories for Sciences, Engineering, Pharmacy, Architecture etc, faculty cabins and cubicles, Conference Room, Seminar Hall and sufficient space for Administrations, Accounts and Corporate Resource Centre.</p> <p>The high-quality accommodation, separate for boys and girls, on a shared basis, with dining facilities are provided in the University. The University offers a varied program throughout the year. Students and Faculty/Staff/residing outside the campus are given AC bus facility on payment basis.</p> <p>The Central Library has 6500 books and 25 journal and e-databases journals with access to digital library and other publications.</p> <p>All activities of the University are being monitored using the state of the art systems, network enables among the staff and students and also serves to integrate and share knowledge. "UNISOFT" is internal software used by staff and students for academic as well as professional guidance.</p> <p>The K.R. Mangalam University has six schools in which it offers Undergraduate and Post-graduate degree courses.
